

Sally was overseas, alone and completely falling apart. She felt mentally and emotionally shattered. Her past of pain and abuse had caught up with her again; it was a cycle of self-sabotage that had trapped her for her whole life. But this time, Sally didn't know if she could survive it.

"Something in me just broke," she says. "I pretty much just gave up on life."

As a child, Sally endured physical and emotional abuse at the hands of her mother, stepfather and siblings. After being told over and over that she was worthless, Sally started to believe it was true. In the years that followed, that pain prevented her from having a career or healthy relationships.

But when her mother died and the COVID-19 pandemic hit while Sally was living overseas, she reached a breaking point. She knew she had to come home and address her past once and for all.

"I figured this is where my demons started, so this is where I needed to be to sort them out," she says.

Sally made her way to the Shreveport-Bossier

Rescue Mission, where she joined the New Beginnings Program. Slowly, she began to heal. She opened her heart and mind to the possibility of a new life.

"I started peeling back the layers of my past and surrendering them to the Lord," Sally says. "The Mission showed me that I am not who my family says I am. I am who God says I am – and He says I am beautifully and wonderfully made."

"I'm not completely whole yet, but I am getting there. I was broken beyond a human's ability to repair. That was only possible with the Lord."

Sally has since graduated from the New Beginnings Program, got a full-time job that she loves and has her own apartment!

With Jesus' love in her heart and hope for the future, Sally is grateful for your support this Easter. "I know that if I let Him, God will take my broken pieces and turn them into something even more beautiful than before."

"I was able to keep it together just long enough to make it back to Shreveport. This is where I was born."
